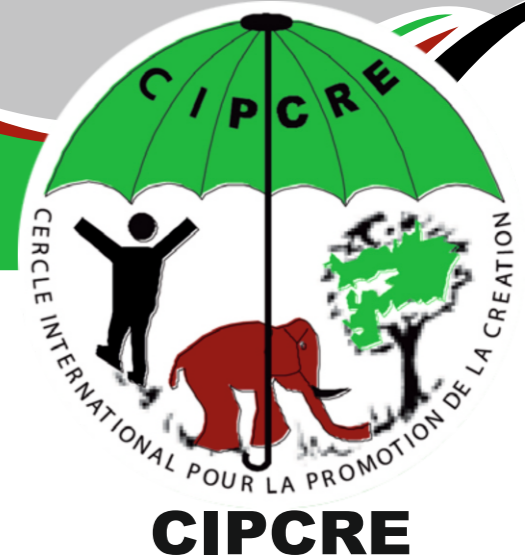

Our programs, and specific activities

Sustainable Agriculture, Entrepreneurship and Community Hygiene Program (PADEHCOM)

Main activities

- Promoting agro-ecology and organic farming
- Initiate students into organic farming through the establishment of organic gardens as teaching aids in 10 schools across the 05 pilot villages
- Promote hygiene and sanitation practices in schools and in the community
- Promote eco-entrepreneurship to support measures of adaptation and mitigate of the effects of climate change
- Set up incubators of entrepreneurial and cultural initiatives on the access to employment and production growth among women and youths
- Data collection for knowledge and experience on organic agriculture
- Capitalization and diffusion of good practices on organic agriculture.



Peace and Social Cohesion Program (PACOS)

Main activities

- Promoting non-violence in schools milieu
- Strengthen good living together within communities through interreligious cooperation
- Promote peaceful management of land and agro-pastoral conflicts within communities
- Strengthen the offer of inclusive education and contribute to the protection of children against violence and social inequalities
- Develop a mechanism for managing complaints, preventing and dealing with gender-based violence related to the Babadjou-Bamenda road works.



Human Rights and Citizen Participation Program (PDHUPAC)

Main activities

- Systematize the process of humanization of widowhood rites through customary codes in 4 divisions of West region
- Strengthen community system on the protection of children against violence
- Promote civic participation of children, youths and women for a more inclusive local governance
- Promote women's economic and social rights through sensitizations and establishment of endogens related mechanisms
- Mobilize the civil society for advocacy with local and national authorities in favor of the rights of most vulnerable groups
- Project for the promotion of community environment protective of children against sexual, cultural, and religious violence (PECPEVI) in the West and Adamawa regions
- Strengthening the child protection system and promotion of everyday life skills among youths and adolescents in school and out of schools (RESPEC-VIE 2) in Yaounde 2 subdivision
- Advocacy for the amelioration of access to civil status services.
